Bible Study Theme for March 2026

“Standing on the Promises of God”

Key Thought | God’s promises reveal His character and faithfulness. What God says, He will fulfill.

Scripture: 2 Corinthians 1:20 “For all the promises of God in him are yes, and in him Amen...”

1. God Promises ‘His Presence’

Scripture: Deuteronomy 31:8 “The Lord himself goes before you and will be with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you.”

Discussion & Life Application

- When have you experienced God’s presence in a difficult time?
 - How does knowing God is with you change your outlook?
 - ***You never face life’s battles alone.***

2. God Promises ‘Peace’

Scripture: John 14:27 “Peace I leave with you; my peace I give unto you...”

Discussion & Life Application

- What is the difference between God’s peace and the world’s peace?
 - What situations in life require you to trust God’s peace?
 - ***God’s peace guards our hearts even in chaos.***

3. God Promises ‘Provision’

Scripture: Philippians 4:19 “But my God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus.”

Discussion & Life Application

- What needs has God already provided in your life?
 - How can gratitude strengthen faith?
 - ***God knows your needs before you ask.***

4. God Promises ‘Strength’

Scripture: Isaiah 40:31 “They that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength...”

Discussion & Life Application

- What does it mean to “wait on the Lord”?
 - How does God renew strength spiritually?
 - ***God gives strength when ours runs out.***

5. God Promises ‘Salvation’

Scripture: Romans 10:9 “If you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus, and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you shall be saved.”

Discussion & Life Application

- Why is salvation the greatest promise?
 - How can believers share this promise with others?
 - ***Salvation is the foundation of every promise of God.***

6. God Promises ‘Guidance’

Scripture: Proverbs 3:5–6 “Trust in the Lord with all your heart... and He shall direct your paths.”

Truth: When we trust God, He leads us.

7. God Promises ‘Eternal Life’

Scripture: John 3:16 “For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son...”

Truth: The greatest promise is life forever with God.

Reflection Questions

1. Which promise do you need most in this season of life?
 2. How can remembering God's promises strengthen your faith this week?
 3. What promise of God can you share with someone else?
 4. How have you seen God fulfill a promise in your life?
 5. How can remembering God's promises strengthen your faith?

Encouragement

Introduction

In this activity, you will learn about God's promises in the Bible. You will read a passage, identify key promises, and summarize them. This will help you understand more about what God has promised to His people.

- **Covenant:** An agreement or promise between God and His people. **Example:** God's promise to Noah after the flood.
- **Eternal:** Never ending or lasting forever. **Example:** God's eternal love for His people.
- **Faithfulness:** The quality of being faithful or loyal. Example: God's faithfulness to keep His promises.
- **Redeem:** To save or rescue. Example: God promises to redeem those who trust in Him.
- **Bless:** To bring good or happiness. **Example:** God promises to bless His followers.

Title: The Promise to Abraham | Scripture Reference _____

Long ago, God spoke to a man named Abraham. God promised that Abraham would have many children, who would become a great nation. This nation would be blessed, and through it, all the families of the earth would be blessed.

Abraham's descendants were to inherit a special land promised by God. He told Abraham to have faith and follow His guidance. In return, God would always be with him and give him great rewards.

<p>Moses led the Israelites out of Egypt. God promised them a land flowing with milk and honey. This land was called Canaan. They had to trust God and follow His path to reach this land.</p>
